A new name is added to the national organ transplant waiting list every 10 minutes.



In 2011, a total of 6,669 patients died while waiting for organ transplants. On average, 18 people died each day because of the shortage of donated organs.

In 2011, there were just 8,126 deceased organ donors in the United States. There were even fewer living donors (6,019).
